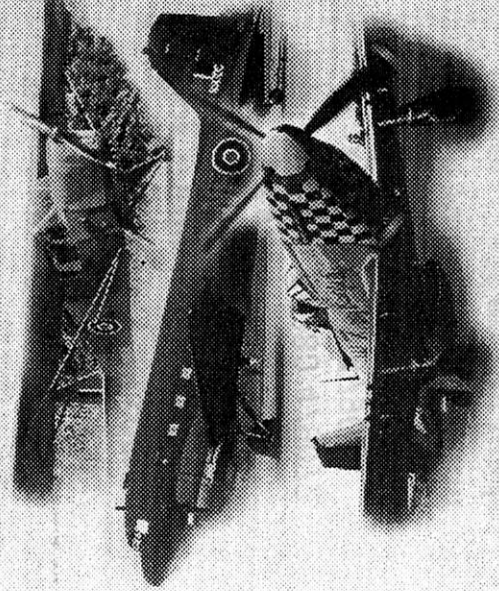

Spanhoe Airfield was home to the USAAF 315th Troop Carrier Group of the 9th Army Airforce. From 1944 to 1945, Spanhoe's C-47 Dakotas towed the WACO gliders which carried the British, American and Polish paratroopers and supplies to the Arnhem bridges, D-Day beaches, and finally, the Rhine crossing.

FIGHTING THE WAR ON THE HOMEFRONT

Agriculture was under great pressure in the war years to produce food to feed everyone at home. To celebrate this we will have a display of vintage tractors and working machinery from the humble standard Fordson, which many Land Army girls learned to drive, to threshing machines producing the end product.

Transportation by roads played a major part in moving produce to and from rural communities, but on a much smaller scale than today. Ammunition, troops and raw materials were moved around the United Kingdom at 20mph speed limit and lorries were always loaded by hand and driven with black-out lights during air raid attack.
